







Number of HSPs by sectors and responsibility levels – South East LHIN









- Most Francophones patients access services through HSPs that are not identified
- 66.7% (6) of identified health service providers report "Clients self-identify as Francophone" as their first method of identifying Francophones patients
- 80.9 % of non-identified health service providers report "Clients self-identify as Francophone" as their first method of identifying Francophones patients

 Most sectors have at least one HSP with an obligation to provide FLHS, except Community Health Centres

 Most HSPs capture client satisfaction, but most of them don't have specific data regarding Francophone clients

There is some capacity in terms of HR

 Not all HSPs have a mechanism in place to align Francophone clients to their HR with FLHS capacity

Impact



Linguistic barriers have a negative impact for both Francophone patients and the health care system, such as:

- Increased risks of errors in diagnosis, medical errors and incorrect treatment plans, causing additional costs for the system;
- A feeling of helplessness, increased stress, and dissatisfaction among patients who do not feel understood by health professionals and may choose to postpone their visits to the doctor;
- Health service professionals also feel helpless, experience increased stress and dissatisfaction in trying to provide the best care possible.

SCOPE OF FLS INFORMATION REQUEST



- 31 providers were sent a questionnaire
- 24 responded between October 7th and November 11th 2019

ST. LAWRENCE YOUTH ASSOCIATION

- •Achievement St. Lawrence Observation & Detention Home: Is an 8 bed, male facility. The primary function is to serve as an intake point for young persons in conflict with the law 12-17 years of age remanded into detention.
- •Sundance: Is a 10 bed secure detention/custody facility for female youth in conflict with the law 12-17 years of age. Counseling, school programs and group work are provided on site. Admission are contingent upon the YCJA legislative criteria.
- •Community Support Team: The CST offers intensive, short term and flexible support to 12-17 year old persons in conflict with the law.
- •Intensive Support and Supervision Program: The ISSP is a sentencing option under the YCJA. It is an alternative to custody that provides intensive services in a community setting to youth with serious mental health issues who would likely have been sentenced to custody but can be appropriately supported and supervised in the community.
- •Youth Justice Family Worker Program: The Youth Justice Family Worker provides support to the families of youth in conflict with the law to support rehabilitation and address situations that put youth at risk for re-offending.
